- -God's presence isn't just better than everything else—it's what we truly need -We were created to abide in Him, and everything else falls short.
- Vs. 10

A single day in your courts is better than a thousand anywhere else! I would rather be a gatekeeper in the house of my God than live the good life in the homes of the wicked.

- God's presence is a better home than what we can make or find.

Ecclesiastes 1:14 (NLT)

I observed everything going on under the sun, and really, it is all meaningless—like chasing the wind.

-Our hearts will remain restless until we learn to rest in him.

God is a better leader than I am a follower

Isaiah 40:7-8 (NLT)

The grass withers and the flowers fade beneath the breath of the LORD. And so it is with people.

- ⁸ The grass withers and the flowers fade, but the word of our God stands forever.
 - -Everything but Him will fade away

-Seeking God requires intentionality

DESPERATION BRINGS TRANSFORMATION BECAUSE WE RUN TO HIM.

WE MAKE OUR HOME IN HIM AND NOT IN A SUBSTITUTE

Vs 4-5:

Vs. 6-7:

When they walk through the Valley of Weeping, it will become a place of refreshing springs. The autumn rains will clothe it with blessings. They will continue to grow stronger, and each of them will appear before God in Jerusalem.
